# The Council's Response:

The Council's view remains that any discussion of Appendices 3 and 4 of this item is likely to involve the disclosure of exempt information as defined in the following paragraph of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972:

(3) Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).

In the circumstances, and having regard to the public interest, it is considered that the Executive should have the opportunity to discuss these documents in private, if it so wishes. It will be for the Executive to determine whether or not to move into private during the meeting based on the course the discussion takes.
