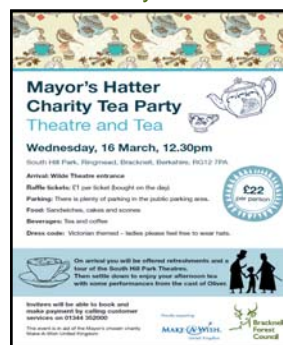

Adult Social Care, Health & Housing

Heathlands

- Outcome of consultation on re-provision and closure considered and changes to service model agreed
- 1970s building, inferior standards
- High vacancy rates
 - 10 permanent residents since mid 2014
 - 40% drop in day care attendance since January 2015
- Very high unit cost
- Team of experienced officers to work with residents and families to find alternative using successful 'Ladybank model'



Children, Young People & Learning (1)

School Places Plan agreed

- Current pupil numbers:
 - 9,729 Primary
 - 6,608 Secondary
- Predicted increase by 2020: 18% & 26% respectively
- Plans based upon current house building programmes
- Historically accurate within 1%



Children, Young People & Learning (2)

School Admission Arrangements

- Review needed because of housing development plus Charters School's decision to remove feeder schools criteria
- Primary feeder criteria removed in rest of Borough
- Introduction of more shared designated areas to accommodate phasing of housing growth
- Protection given to siblings for six years

Great Hollands Primary School expansion agreed



Other Issues

Community Safety Partnership Strategic Assessment agreed

- Priorities largely unchanged from 2015

Acquisition of Magistrates Court plus in-borough commercial property

Agency Workers Framework contract agreed
