# Climate Change

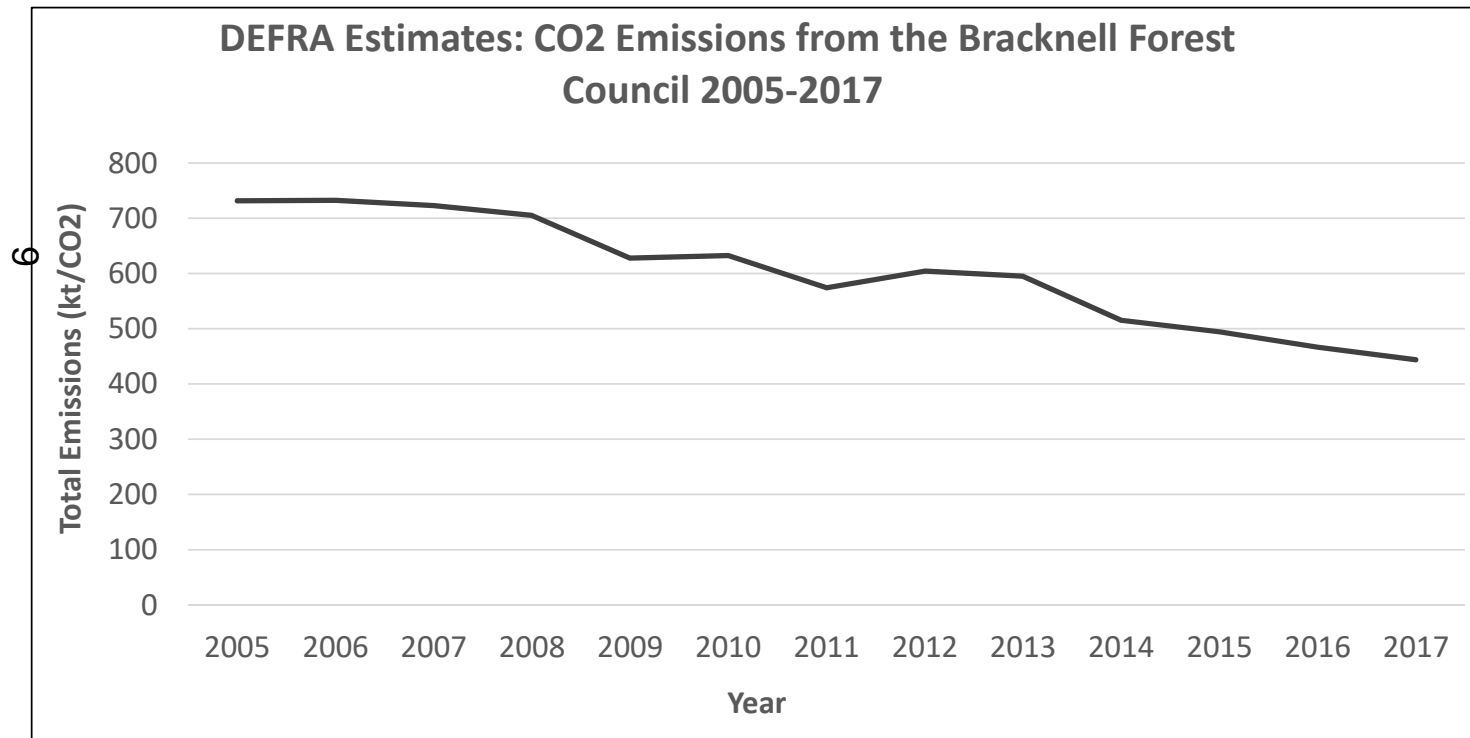
- In October 2018, the IPCC reported that at the **international level**, the climate change problem is worsening.
- Under the **Climate Change Act**, the UK must reach a net greenhouse gas emission value of **zero by 2050**.

- **Responsibility lies with the Secretary of State** to respond under the Climate Change Act, therefore funding from national government will be needed to support these local level efforts

Data from DEFRA indicates a trend towards a reduction in Bracknell Forest's CO2 emissions but some emitters have been excluded from this e.g. transport by rail

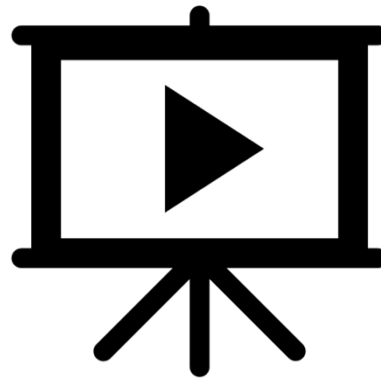


# Decision making

- Particulate matter and nitrogen dioxide are harmful to human health. Generally, for people in good health, short term, moderate exposure should not give any cause for concern. However, high levels or long term exposure can lead to the worsening of existing health conditions or the development of new cardiovascular/respiratory conditions.
- 13 • In 2010 the [Department of Health's Committee on Medical Effects of Air Pollutants](#) estimated the burden of Particulate Matter in the UK was equivalent to nearly 29,000 deaths in 2008, 25,000 of which were in England. DEFRA estimate the burden of Nitrogen Dioxide is equivalent to nearly 23,500 deaths per year in the UK. It is likely there is some overlap between the pollutants so it is not possible to estimate the total health burden.

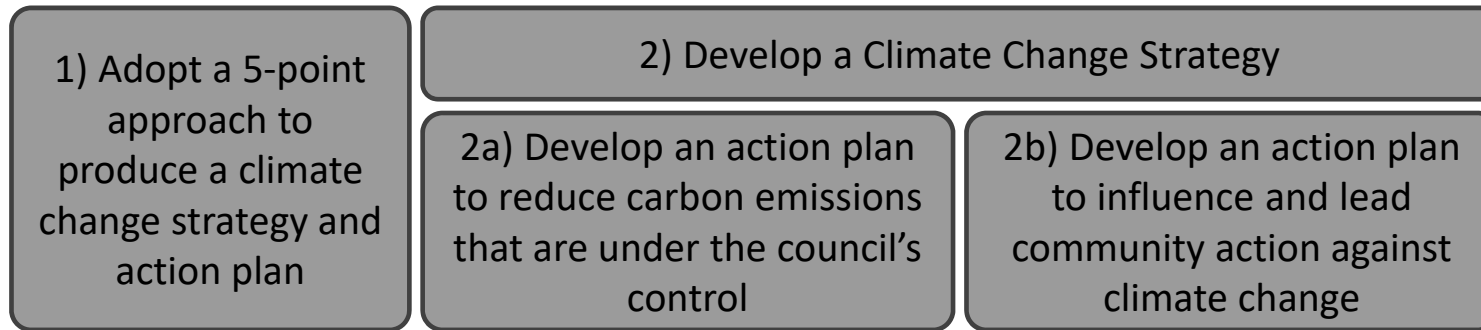
Headline examples of completed and/or ongoing projects include:

- 1,416 trees will have been planted by the end of the 2019/20 winter as part of a green highway project
- £1.2 million awarded by Warm Homes - March 2019 (shared partnership with other LAs) to provide affordable heating solutions to poorer households
- LED lanterns with Telensa controls have been installed on all 14,500 street lights, accounting for energy savings of 55% between April 2016 and April 2019

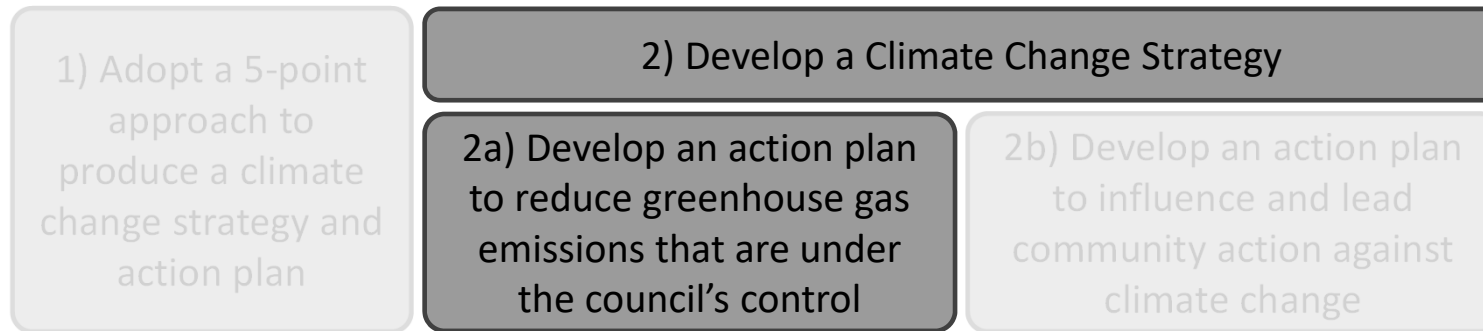
2b) Develop an action plan to influence and lead community action against climate change

- **Recognise the importance** – climate change will impact on supply and demand of services so it must be given a high profile
- **Allocate finance** – internal or external financial resources are required to tackle the problem
- **Provide training** – staff must be trained so that they understand the context in which they are working
- **Engage** – local authorities have the ability to bring public and private sector bodies together to work collectively
- **Advocate** – as the only democratically elected organisation in the area, the council has a duty to lead on matters as serious as climate change



# Strategy

## Bracknell Forest Council: Towards a Climate Change Strategy



In order to reach and prove a state of net greenhouse gas emissions of zero by 2050, it is proposed that:

- A consultancy is tasked with establishing **baseline emissions for BFC** and advising on how to track progress against targets up to 2050
- Focus will be placed on **direct emissions** from activities under the organisation's control e.g. fleet vehicles and air conditioning; **indirect emissions from electricity** purchased by the organisation; **other indirect emissions** from activities that are powered by sources that the council does not own or control e.g. business travel and procurement
- An action plan will be developed against all the three areas mentioned above
