- Maximum of 30 people outdoors
- Rule of six, or two households indoors
- Close contact (hugging) is allowed when meeting family and friends, only if you feel safe to do so

- Indoor hospitality
- Indoor entertainment and attractions
- Organised indoor sport (adult)
- Remaining accommodation
- Remaining outdoor entertainment (including performances)

- Domestic overnight stays
- International travel (subject to review)
- Most significant life events (up to 30 people)
- Indoor events: 1,000 or 50 per cent (plus pilots)
- Outdoor seated events: 10,000 or 25 per cent (plus pilots)
- Outdoor other event: 4,000 or 50 per cent (plus pilots)

## Guide to choosing the right COVID-19 test


This advice applies to everyone regardless of vaccination.

Adults or children with COVID-19 symptoms

Book a PCR test at GOV.UK or by calling 119

While waiting for your test you and your household members (including support bubble) must self-isolate and only leave home to attend a test centre.

If you have COVID-19 symptoms or a positive LFT result, self-isolate and book a PCR test by visiting GOV.UK or call 119. The confirmatory PCR test should be booked within 48 hours. If you receive negative test results, this is only an indication that you are unlikely to have COVID-19, not 100% confirmation - continue to observe hands face space and get regularly tested.



## The importance of self-isolation

If your LFT is positive it is important for you and your household to self-isolate straight away and book a PCR test to confirm the result

If your test is negative it is unlikely that you were carrying the virus at the time of test, however it is important to continue to follow all guidelines

#### LFT Result

If you test positive for Covid-19 you must:

- Stay isolated
- Get a PCR test straight away
- Order your PCR by calling 119 or online via www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test
