Generation rent assert that renters from a minority ethnic community, are less likely to receive a positive response when applying to rent a home than white applicants. In a 2021 survey, conducted by the housing charity Shelter answered by over 500 black and Asian adults, 14% of black respondents and 10% of Asian respondents said they had experienced discrimination while house hunting. The Race Equality Foundation suggests that legislation also requires landlords to check a tenants status, has contributed to discrimination in the lettings market. Working-age adults in black (22%), Asian (18%), and mixed (18%) households were more likely to be in persistent low income than those from the white ethnic group (10%) This support is offering financial assistance to low income households with a shortfall between benefits and rental costs, of whom a number may be from a minority ethnic community.
