# RELEASE OF SECTION 106 FUNDING Director of Children, Young People & Learning

## 1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To agree the release of S106 contributions as part of the 2014/15 Education Capital Programme.

## 2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Executive Member agrees the allocation of £22,704.80 of S106 contributions as part of the 2014/15 Education Capital Programme to the schemes set out in the attached APPENDIX A.

#### 3 REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

3.1 The Executive Member has delegated responsibility to release S106 funding to specific schemes, up to the total of £250,000 agreed by Full Council. In June 2014 the Executive Member approval released for £216,783 of S106 funding, and the £22,704.80 in this report is the part of the remaining balance of the £250,000.

### 5 SUPPORTING INFORMATION

#### S106 Contributions

- 5.1 S106 contributions are paid to the Council by housing developers to meet the cost of the impact of their development on the Council's infrastructure.
- 5.2 Bracknell Forest can only seek education S106 contributions for education where there is a deficit of places at the school in whose Designated Area the housing development is located. Because the Council has a statutory duty to provide sufficient pupil places, the highest priority for this funding is to create the additional school places required to address deficits of places across the Borough.
- 5.3 S106 Contributions are paid to the Council, not to individual schools because the statutory duty rests with the Council. The majority of individual contributions are not given in respect of any particular school because it is recognised that not all schools are capable of being expanded. Contributions do however carry restrictions over how the Council can use them, including a requirement for them to be spent within a given radius of the housing development, usually up to 3km for primary education contributions. This does allow the Council to spend contributions on neighbouring schools if they fall within the prescribed radius.

#### Unrestricted

- 5.4 S106 Contribution are paid to the Council to provide, expand or improve youth facilities usually within 3km of the development site.
- 5.5 S106 Contribution are paid to the Council and towards the cost of employment training and improving skill levels with 10 km of the development.
- 5.6 The individual contributions which are the subject of this report have all been allocated in line with the terms of the individual Section 106 agreements to which they relate, and allocated to the relevant construction projects as follows:
  - 5.6.1 Holly Spring: £555. The money will contribute towards the cost of the project to expand the Infant & Junior schools by 1FE from a combined PAN of 60 to 90 to create 210 additional places from September 2013.
  - 5.6.2 Owlsmoor £4,076.80. The money will contribute towards the cost of the proposed expansion of the school by 1FE from a PAN of 76 to 90 in the intake year to create 98 additional places from September 2015 onwards.
  - 5.6.3 Trax/ North Ascot Youth Centre £4,755. As from January 2014 Trax/N Ascot is managed by The Ark. The money will enable this voluntary/community group to enhance their ICT provision at the centre and they will develop improvements to the ICT provision with the introduction of Apple iMac computers and enhancements to the existing wireless provision. Additionally to this there will be a need for the security of the kit to ensure it is safe.
  - 5.6.4 NRG/Coopers Hill WIFI £725. The money will contribute towards the cost of wiring for WIFI which will enhance the service offered by the Youth Centre.
  - 5.6.5 Bracknell Open Learning Centre £12,593. The money will contribute to the funding of fixed TV screens and IT cabling to advertise courses.

#### Funding

- 5.7 The Council's 2014/15 education capital programme includes £250,000 of general section 106 contributions for the Executive Member to allocate to individual schemes. The total value of this report is £22,704.80 which falls within this total.
- 5.8 All of the contributions set out in this report have already been received by the Council.
