Planning & Transport (1)

Draft Parking Standards Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) – Consultation

- · Existing policies 8 years old
- New document builds on this and looks to address
 - school pick up
 - garage provision
 - lower car ownership areas
 - balance between on street and off street parking costs
- 6 week consultation until 30 November

Planning & Transport (2)

LED Lighting

- Invest to save proposal to replace all street lights with LED
- £7.3m investment delivers minimum £8m savings over 20 years
- Savings higher if fuel prices increase
- 2857 tonnes of CO² to be saved each year
- Supplementary capital spend recommended to Council

Planning & Transport (3)

Local Enforcement Plan agreed

Sets out clear standards and processes to be applied

Highways Infrastructure Asset Management Plan

- Sets out maintenance policies
- Focus on priorities identified by Department for Transport
- · Sets framework but not level of spending



Finance & Transformation (1)

Medium Term Financial Strategy

- Government looking to reduce public expenditure to address deficit
- Assume 25% 40% reduction in Government support over next 4 years
- Translates to savings of £20 25M
- Council Plan sets framework for addressing this gap



Garden Waste Collections - 2016/17

- Household refuse collection is statutory requirement funded by Council Tax and free at point of delivery for all residents
- · Garden waste collection is a discretionary service
- Current charge = £30 introduced in 2012
 free year initially given to "buy-back" bins
- Cost of services is £53 per household using it
- · Reduction in subsidy by increasing charge to £40

Future Provision of Services

- Consultation on re-commissioning Heathlands Residential Care Home and Day Care Centre in private sector
- Current 1970's building does not meet modern standards or future resident expectation
- Current occupancy <50%
- Very close liaison with residents and families essential

Adult Social Care, Health & Housing (3)

Care Act Implementation: Outcome of consultation considered

- Council to charge for residential and nursing care (as now)
- · Financial assessment of couples will change
 - Joint assessments no longer allowed by Act so Bracknell Forest Council obliged to assess individuals
- · Changes for Universal or Discretionary Deferred Payments agreed K \$ Bracknell Forest Council
- · No charges for any support to carers

Culture, Corporate Services & Public Protection (1)

Control of Horses Act 2015

- · New policy approved to deal with horses grazing in public places
- · Only applies to Council land (including Town & Parish Councils)
- 96 hours notice for removal to owner
