Points to note -

- ▶ These figures relate to the number of exclusions issued as a percentage of pupil population NOT the number of pupils excluded e.g. pupils may have received more than one exclusion. This is the way the DfE publishes this data for comparative purposes
- ▶ Official DfE Statistical First Release for 14/15 will be published at the end of July 16. Therefore, there is no official data for years 14/15 and 15/ 16
- ▶ This data refers to school data recorded on the ONE system and relates to the Statistical First Release. Due to the manner in which statistics are collated there is some deviation from the figures that are reported within RAISE, however the trend remains the same
- ▶ Brakenhale has a new Head teacher and has recently converted to academy status. Increase in Fixed Period Exclusion is not unusual in these circumstances but must be monitored
- ▶ College Hall PRU - no national benchmarks are published for Pupil Referral Units. However, data is collated by the DfE and this has been requested via Freedom of Information. Regardless of benchmark data, this level of Fixed Period Exclusion from a specialist behaviour resource is concerning although the trend is now in the correct direction
- ▶ Any child excluded for 1 - 5 days is the responsibility of their parents and must not be in a public place during school hours. If a school issues a Fixed Period Exclusion beyond five days they must provide suitable full time education from day 6 of the exclusion
