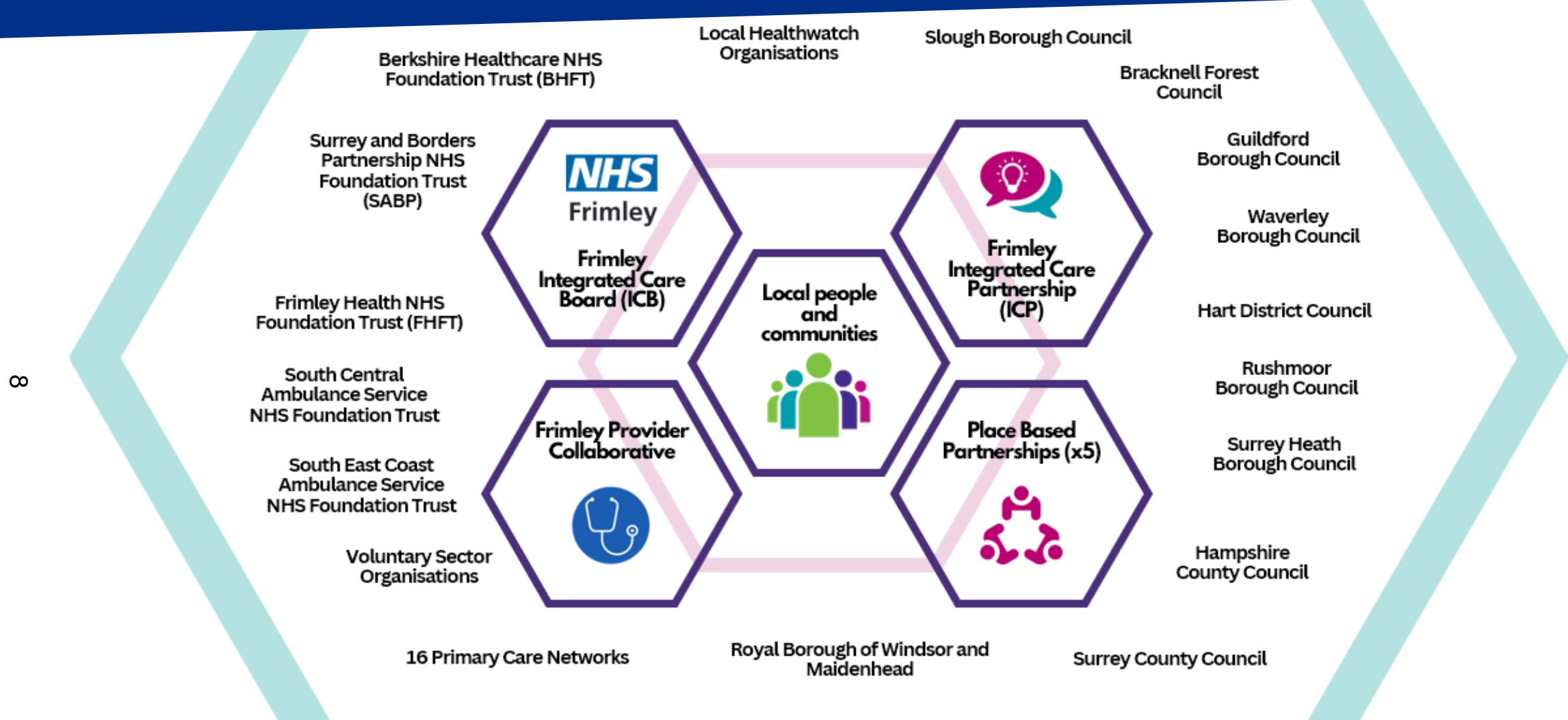

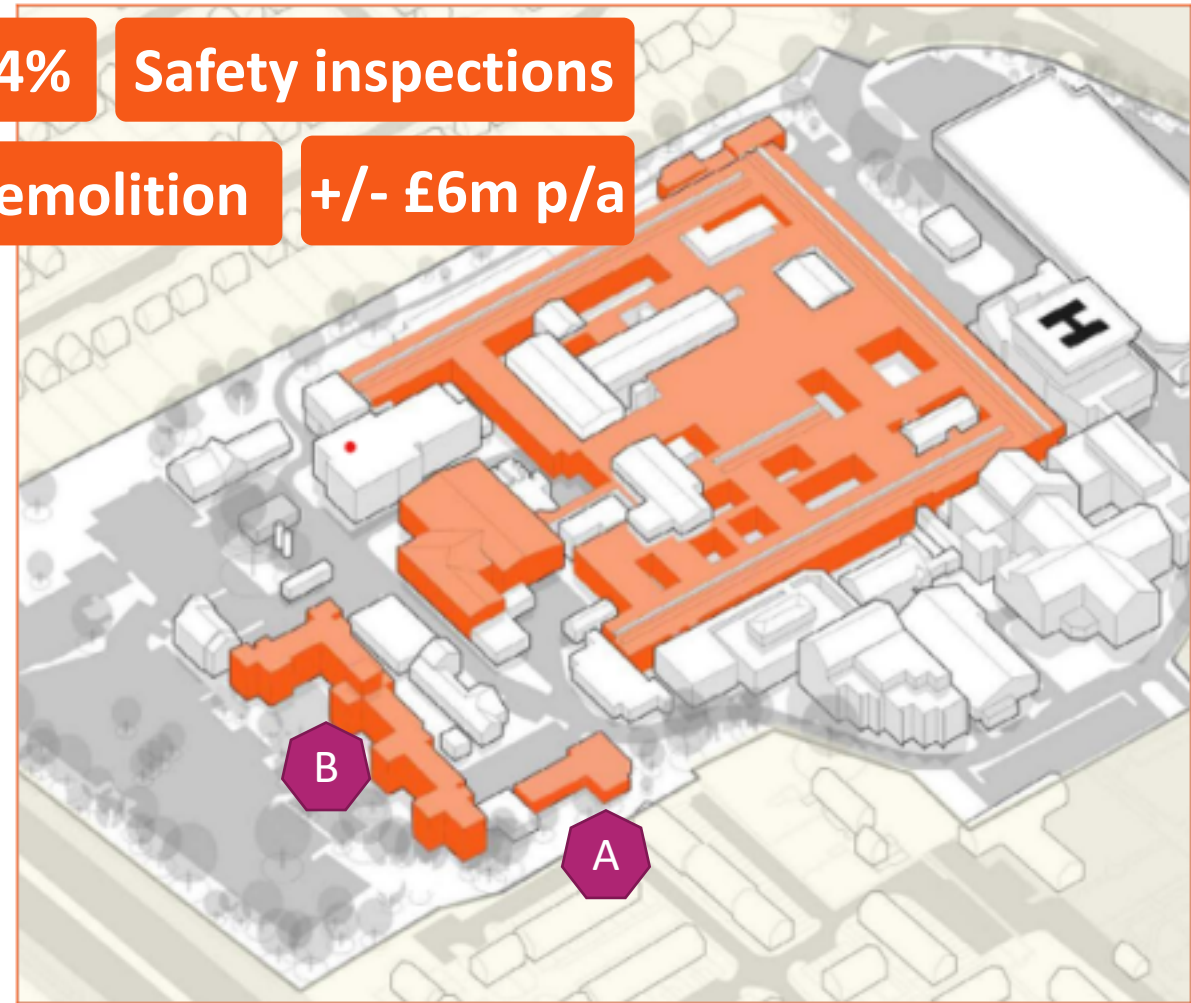



We are delighted that we have been included in the government's New Hospital Programme

- We are delivering a new state-of-the-art replacement for Frimley Park Hospital by 2030
- Building a hospital on the current site is not a viable option:
 - ¹⁴ • it would cause **significant disruption** to our patients, staff, and hospital services
 - it would be **more expensive**
 - it would be **impossible to complete** a phased build by our deadline of 2030
- As a result, we are now actively looking at alternative locations for a replacement for Frimley Park Hospital.

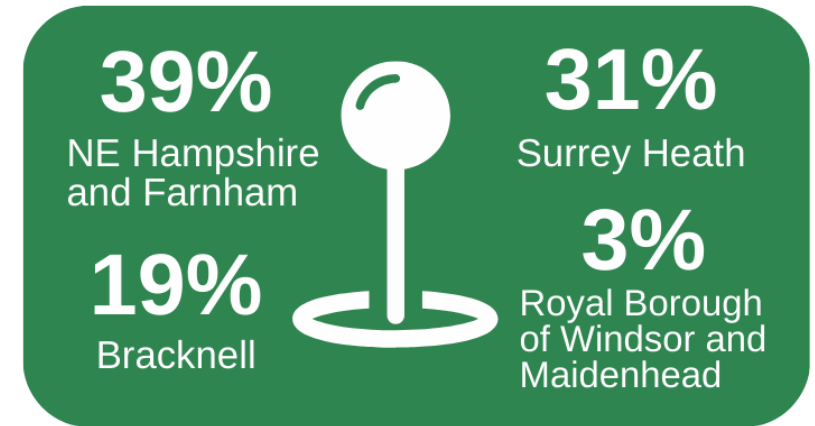

- 56%** Access by car
- 35%** Distance from current site
- 31%** Access by public transport
- 25%** All equally important

What is needed?

- 12%** Accessible hospital
- 11%** Accessible public transport
- 10%** Access by car

What is missing?

- 44%** Suitable car parking for all

Planning and restrictions

What's most important?

- 50%** All equally important
- 37%** Expansion potential
- 9%** Local noise and pollution
- 4%** Development height parameters

What is needed?

- 55%** Need for future-proofing
- 28%** Population growth and demand increase
- 15%** Consider impact on residents

What is missing?

- 27%** Suitable car parking for all

Purchasing the site

What's most important?

- 66%** All equally important
- 24%** Availability of land
- 9%** Readiness to sell
- 1%** Appetite to sell

What is needed?

- 27%** All aspects are important
- 20%** Minimise delays
- 17%** Locating available land for sale

What is missing?

- 37%** Availability of appropriate land
