We the undersigned, residents of Sandhurst, strongly object to this change of use and insist that you, the Council, our elected representatives, cancel the current plans. Furthermore, not to introduce any such plans for the use of this field in the future.

Parking problems – Wildridings Square

648. Planning Control Sub Committee

The recommendation of the Planning Control Sub Committee from its meeting held on 16 March 2000 was before the Council (Minute 109 refers). At the invitation of the Mayor, the Director of Planning and Transportation reported on discussions with the applicants which had taken place following the Sub Committee meeting and, in the light of that information, the Chairman of the Planning Control Sub Committee sought the Council's permission to withdraw the recommendation in order that the Sub Committee could consider proposed revisions to the current application.

In accordance with Standing Order 25 Councillors Finnie and Wade declared a pecuniary interest in the following item and withdrew from the Chamber during its consideration.

THE DEPUTY MAYOR, COUNCILLOR EGAN, IN THE CHAIR

649. Crowthorne Parish Council – Application in respect of Members' Interests

The Council had been notified by Crowthorne Parish Council that it proposed to consider the condition of unadopted roads in the Parish at its next meeting on 16 May 2000. At the time the Parish Council meeting took place, there would be ten Parish Councillors, five of whom would have a direct pecuniary interest in the matter. The Parish Council had requested that a dispensation be granted to permit the five Councillors to speak and vote on the relevant agenda item.

RESOLVED that

- (i) Subject to the Condition in (ii) below the following named Members of Crowthorne Parish Council be granted dispensation to speak and vote at meetings of the Parish Council held on or before 31 December 2000 on any agenda item concerning the condition and/or adoption of roads within the Parish of Crowthorne which are not maintainable at public expense:-

- (ii) The dispensation referred to in (i) above shall not extend to speaking or voting on any motion proposing expenditure upon or works to unadopted roads within Crowthorne by the Parish Council.

THE MAYOR, COUNCILLOR JAMES G FINNIE IN THE CHAIR

In accordance with Standing Order 25 Councillor Simonds declared a pecuniary interest in motion 4/2000 and withdrew from the Chamber during its consideration.

Motion 4/2000

Motion 4/2000 as set out in the agenda for the meeting was moved by Councillor Flood and seconded by Councillor Bettison. An amendment was then moved by Councillor Jones and seconded by Councillor Beadsley in the following terms:

delete the first sentence and replace by : "that this Council continue to work in close co-operation with the Meteorological Office to explore every opportunity in enabling them to achieve what they require while remaining in the Borough."

delete "assistance" and replace with "support".

delete "Conservative".

On being put to the meeting and a vote being taken, the amendment was declared not carried.

The mover of the motion accepted an amendment in the following terms:

Delete "member of the Labour Government" and replace by "Labour Member of Parliament".

On being put to the meeting, and a vote being taken, motion 4/2000, as amended, was declared carried. It was therefore

RESOLVED that this Council deplores the arrogant, cynical and uncaring attitude displayed by a local Labour Member of Parliament in her desire to move the Headquarters of the Meteorological Office away from Bracknell. Further, that this Council seeks the assistance of the two Conservative Members of Parliament representing this Borough and pledges its support for the employees, spouses, children and other family members who face the prospect of either having to move hundreds of miles away or seeking alternative employment.

(ii) Motion 5/2000

Motion 5/2000 as set out in the agenda for the meeting was moved by Councillor Harrison and seconded by Councillor Ward. In accordance with Standing Order 8 (iv), the Mayor indicated that the Motion would stand referred to the Social Services & Housing Committee.

640. **Closing Remarks**

The Mayor took the opportunity of this final meeting of the current Council to record his best wishes to all candidates in the forthcoming Borough Council

elections. He thanked all members of the Council for their support during his term of office as Mayor.

The Leader of the Council on behalf of the Council thanked the Mayor for his hard work and dedication to his mayoral duties during the past three years and remarked on the outstanding contribution the Mayor had made to the proceedings of the Council.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the Council to review the allocation of seats to party groups at the annual meeting. This report consequently proposes arrangements for allocating seats and appointments to Committees for 1999/2000.

2 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 That:

- (i) the total number of seats on ordinary Committees appointed by the Council shall be 96 and that such seats shall be allocated to party groups as follows:-

Conservative Group – 72

Labour Group – 24

- (ii) Members be appointed to serve on the following Committees in accordance with nominations made by the political groups as set out in the Annex to the report.

3 ADVICE RECEIVED FROM STATUTORY AND OTHER OFFICERS

Borough Solicitor

- 3.1 The Borough Solicitor's advice is incorporated in the report.

Borough Finance Officer

- 3.2 There are no financial implications arising from the above recommendations.

Access Implications

- 3.3 Not relevant to this report.

4 SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 4.1 The Council's main Committee structure was reviewed by the Strategy and Policy Committee on 12 April 2000. On the recommendation of that Committee, the Council on 26 April 2000, decided that no changes should be made to the Committee structure in the forthcoming year other than the discontinuation of the Direct Services Board which was no longer required. The resulting structure is shown in Annexe A. The Council is now required to determine the allocation of seats on Committees to political groups for the forthcoming year and to make appointments in accordance with the wishes of the group to which each seat has been allocated.

- 4.2 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 introduced Regulations in order to ensure that the political balance on Committees reflects the political complexion of the Council. In order to achieve this the Council is required to observe the following principles as far as practicable in making appointments to ordinary Committees ie:

- (a) no Committee should comprise Members drawn from one political group only;
- (b) the majority of seats on each Committee should be allocated to a political group if the number of members of the group is a majority of the Authority's membership;
- (c) subject to satisfying (a) and (b) above, the total number of seats allocated to each political group on all ordinary Committees should reflect the political balance of the Council; and

(d) subject to (a) – (c) above, the number of seats on each Committee allocated to each political group should reflect the political balance of the Council.

4.3 The above four principles apply to all Committees appointed by the Council and to Sub-Committees appointed by those Committees.

4.4 Following the Borough elections held on 4 May 2000, the proportions of seats held by the two groups represented on the Council are Conservative 75% and Labour 25%. This effectively means that Committee and Sub Committee sizes need to be determined in multiples of 4 to obtain a perfect match between the overall balance of seats to that on each Committee. The previous Council operated with Committees comprising of 16 Members and Sub Committees of 9 or 5 Members, plus a Planning Control Sub Committee of 20 Members. To achieve an exact match the only change required is to reduce the number of Members in Sub Committees to 8 or 4. The allocation of 96 available seats would therefore be as follows.

This gives a total allocation of 72 seats (75%) to the Conservative Group and 24 seats (25%) to the Labour Group

4.5 The allocation described above is an exact reflection of the proportionate strength of the two political groups. Accordingly nominations to vacant seats made by both groups are annexed to the report and the Council is required to confirm these appointments for the 200/01 Municipal Year.

4.6 Committees are also required to observe political proportionality when setting the membership of Sub-Committees. The formula by which this should be done is set out below:

- 4.7 The Strategy and Policy Committee also recommended on 12 April that a review of the main Committee and Sub Committee structure should be carried out during the first cycle of meetings to ensure it meets the requirements of the new Council. This will be reported to the next meeting of that Committee on 12 July.
