Subject: Objection to new premises alcohol license reference LI/18/00269/LAPRE1 for The Royal Foresters pub in Ascot

Dear Sir,

I wish to make an objection to the new premises alcohol license reference LI/18/00269/LAPRE1 for The Royal Foresters pub in Ascot, made by Oakman Inns and Restaurants.

I am a resident in the semi-detached houses on Priory Road within 50 metres from the pub. I am delighted to see the regeneration of the long-abandoned site, the original representations from the developers was for a primarily food / gastro pub, the alcohol licence application clearly demonstrates a different focus. The proposed closing times demonstrate intention for a late night alcohol establishment which is completely inappropriate having residents so close by and two schools either side.

This is a residential area, the number of residents rising rapidly with the number of housing developments currently in progress. Having patrons leaving this establishment after midnight during Monday - Thursday and 01:30 am on Friday and Saturday/Sunday mornings will obviously create noise disturbance and a likelihood of anti-social behaviour consequently having a negative impact on our quality of life on Priory Road. Noise was previously problematic on weekends when The Beefeater used to close at 00:30, raucous guests walking home often wakened us. The additional hour will negatively impact our quality of life and reduce our ability to sleep.

The local residents in the area are generally families with young children or pensioners in retirement and the extended licensing request isn't acceptable or in keeping with a residential area.

I hope that you will take my objections into account when evaluating this application.
