	There are 7 projects in Analyse phase but they will not all complete this phase at the same time. We expect Independent Living, Bridgewell and Residential Affordability to be the first to complete Analyse in May 2019.
	 Independent Living Creation of a full business case and options appraisal for provision of day and overnight respite for learning disability (LD) clients Long term aim to achieve revenue savings and cost avoidance by delivering a programme of daytime group support and increased overnight respite capacity for LD clients and their families. If successful support costs will reduce, risk of breakdown will reduce and outcomes will improve. Bridgewell Exploring the viability of a residential development for LD clients as there is a shortfall in suitable accommodation Residential affordability
	The project will look to deliver a reduction in bed prices for nursing and residential placements, firstly focussing on older adults with mental health conditions.
	The project aims for more people to return home as opposed to entering residential care after hospital stays by assessing their needs in an extra care environment which is part way between being at home and in residential care
	Review of current service provision to ensure that we are meeting our statutory duties and providing services that meet the needs of the borough in the most cost effective way
	 Earlier Intervention Provision of additional support when identified as required by practitioners to prevent breakdowns with care at home and
