Thank you for your email below in relation to the application for street trading at Savernake Park car park.

The first thing I will note is that if a trading consent is granted, this would be for an initial one month period so the actual impact of trading at this location can be determined. If negative impacts are realised once the trader is in place, then a longer term consent can be refused. If a longer term consent is issued, it does not mean that the trading is a permanent fixture; the consent can still be reviewed or revoked if appropriate.

Anti-social behaviour and litter is a problem in a lot of the Council managed car parks in the borough. One method that has found success elsewhere is by having an 'authorised presence' in the area, people who are carrying out these sorts of anti-social activities are discouraged from congregating and hanging around at that location and move elsewhere.

In respect of litter specifically, the trader would be required to provide a waste receptacle for the use of their customers, as well as to keep the trading area clear of all litter. This would be required by both the conditions attached to the street trading consent and the terms of the rental agreement to occupy the land. If they do not abide by this requirement their consent could be revoked. Again, elsewhere we have found that there has been a significant reduction in litter in the car park following the introduction of a trader to that location.

The trader is not selling the typical sorts of food to attract the 'after drinks' custom, and is also scheduled to finish at 8pm rather than 11pm or later when customers who have left the pub might be looking for something to eat. It is

therefore hoped that the more raucous customers associated with some street traders will not be attracted to this particular site.

Lastly, income generated from the use of the car park by the trader is fed back into the budget of the Parks and Countryside team to provide for the long term maintenance of the site.

Following the closing of the consultation period on 02/05/2019, a decision will be made as to the best way forward with respect to this particular application.

I hope the above may go some way to addressing your concerns but please let me know if you would like any more information or I can assist further.
