Surplus Places

Falling pupil numbers

2003 surplus places

602 (14.5%)

2008 surplus places

883 (21.2%)



Why is this a problem?

- fixed costs become a higher proportion of schools' budgets
- maintenance less cost effective
- managing staffing reductions more difficult and in a greater number of schools as pupil numbers decline



and...

- smaller year groups make school organisation more difficult
- schools become less attractive to new staff
- DfES guidelines breached



Objectives

To ensure that:

- every child continues to have high quality education
- sufficient places in convenient locations
- all children assured of a place in their designated area school



- around 500 places removed
- schools are maintained at a viable size
- 10% surplus remains to ensure adequate scope for parental preference



Housing Developments (1)

Staff College Site

- 730 houses proposed on this site
- Approximately 270 primary age children
- Current designated area Harmans Water, Wildridings and Fox Hill Primary Schools



- Government guidance recommends that only one school should be designated for each area
- Borough Council propose Harmans
 Water Primary because of capacity and
 natural boundaries



Housing Developments (2)

Peacock Farm

- 1500 houses will generate over 500 primary age pupils
- insufficient capacity in nearby schools
- significant distance to travel to other schools

New school required



Outcomes of Consultation



The Council's preferred option

- amalgamate Fox Hill Primary and Wildridings Primary on the Wildridings site (420 place school)
- amalgamate The Pines Infant and Junior Schools on the Junior School site

(210 place school)

 Reduce the size of Birch Hill Primary (449 place school)

Consultation Process

- 6 week consultation period
- consultation documents and standard response forms
- meetings with :
 - Headteachers
 - Chairmen of governing bodies
 - Teacher associations and trade unions
 - Diocesan authorities
 - Members of staff in schools
 - Parents and members of the community
- petitions, letters, e-mails
- website information and responses



Consultation Response

- 4,800 leaflets distributed
- 343 (7%) standard response forms returned
- 124 (36%) supported option one
- 18 (5%) supported option two
- 41 (12%) supported option three



150 (44%) did not support any option

 Of these 74 supported the original option 3, which included elements of option 1.

Executive's proposals

retain a school for each community

retain flexibility over buildings



Recommendations

- Staff College site solely in Harmans Water area
- amalgamate The Pines Infant and Junior Schools on the Junior School site (210 place school)
- reduce the size of Fox Hill
 Primary (210 place school)
- reduce the size of Wildridings
 Primary (315 place school)
- Reduce the size of Birch Hill Primary

(420 place school)

Total Effect

- Removes 505 places
- •Reduces surplus to 14.7% by 2008

This does not include pupils from Staff College site and Peacock Farm developments.



What happens next?

3 February - Executive Member confirms and agrees Statutory Notices

Feb - April Statutory consultation

April - Executive Member considers representations and

determines to proceed

May - School Organisation Committee determines proposals

March onwards-consultation with governing bodies about accommodation

May onwards - planning and building proposals progressed

June onwards - governing bodies constituted and staffing processes begin
